The Office is in receipt of your letter of December 23, 1913 enclosing a request from John C. Fremont and Annie F. Kemp, his sister, for payment to them as heirs to the estate of Samuel Fremont, deceased, the sum of \$3.00 now to his credit on your books.

As the Office is without authority to turn over these funds until the heirship question is formally decided, and as the preliminaries must be undertaken by the Superintendent under whose jurisdiction the two Indians are, it is suggested that you transfer to him the amount of money now on your books to the credit of Samuel Fremont, deceased, with the request that he take the necessary steps to determine the heirs to the estate.
