Ada P. and Clifford Ross Barnett were enrolled at this
School on January the 20th, last, an amount of \$167.00
each was deposited to pay for their tuition. The two
young people are mixed blood members of the Creek Tribe.

The total amount of \$334.00 was deposited with the
Treasurer of the United States, as per Certificate No.
3097, February 9th, 1914.

On January the 26th, last, the mother of the two
children made a request that both of them be given per-
mission to go to her home with her and it was granted.
It is now desired that the amount of \$334.00 that was de-
posited for tuition be returned, and inasmuch as the child-
ren did not remain in School I respectfully recommend that
the amount be returned to me to be forwarded to the proper


