In answer to your letter of March 12, 1914 (Finance-Bookkeeping, F G), in regard to \$334.00 collected during January, 1914, by Moses Friedman, Superintendent, Carlisle Indian School, on account of tuition of two Indian pupils from Creek tribe, you are advised that the accounts of Mr. Friedman for the first fraction, third quarter, show the receipt of \$584.50 on account of tuition. This amount was deposited by the Superintendent per C. D. 3097, dated February 9, 1914, and was covered into the Treasury by repay warrant \$58-20, dated March 12, 1914, to the credit of "Indian School, Carlisle, Pa., 1914." It therefore appears that further action by this office is unnecessary.

Attention is invited to the fact that certificate of deposit No. 3097 dated February 9, 1914, in favor of Moses Friedman, Superintendent, Carlisle Indian School, Pa., included the sum of \$334 collected during January, 1914, for tuition, etc. of two indian pupils from the Creek tribe. This money was covered into the Treasury to the credit of Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, 1913," instead of "Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, 1914." The two pupils have been withdrawn from the Carlisle School, and it is now desired to refund the amount above named. In order that this may be done, it is desired that transfer and counter warrant issue, debiting the appropriation "Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, 1913," and crediting "Indian School, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, 1914," with the above amount.
