John J. Campbell, who appears to be under your jurisdiction, complained to the Office that the authorities of the Carlisle School had withheld \$90 which belonged to him.

Upon inquiry it appears that John J. Campbell had been enrolled at the school but had deserted therefrom, and that under date of June 15 the \$90 in question was transferred to you. Campbell has been advised that it will be necessary for him to apply to you if he requires any of this money, but under the circumstances use your judgment in regard to paying him all or a part thereof, complying of course with existing regulations.
