Replying to the Office's letter of June the 23rd, as was requested by card on July the 17th, I respectfully report that Harry Bonser had gone to his home at Rosebud Agency, South Dakota, before the Office's letter was received here. Accordingly, the action reported in the following copy of a letter that was addressed to Supervisor Davis of the Rosebud Agency was taken:

"There is enclosed herewith check for \$456.39 transferring to your supervision the account of Harry Bonser, together with a copy of a letter from the Office which will explain the situation.

Bonser owes bills in Carlisle aggregating \$82.35 for which check was drawn to pay the same when authorized by the Office. Since the authority has not been granted the check has been cancelled and is enclosed herewith.

Kindly hand this cancelled check to Harry. His bills are also enclosed."

It was believed that Harry would transmit the statement desired by the Office at once upon receipt of the copy of the letter, and for that reason a reply to the communi-
