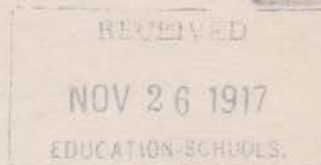

Sir:

Permit me to invite your attention to the case of Clifford Johnson who was readmitted to this school on September 22d and deserted on October 11th. Under date of September 20th a check in the sum of \$200.00 was drawn on the account of Clifford Johnson by Gabe E. Parker, Superintendent of the Five Civilized Tribes, and forwarded to me to apply on Clifford's tuition for the scholastic year beginning in September 1917.

I am now informed that Clifford has enrolled in a business college in Muskogee and is taking bookkeeping and stenography. Mr. Parker requests me to return the \$200.00 sent by U. S. Treasury check #31885 to his office so that it may be applied to the lessor's account.

This check was deposited, in accordance with the regulations, as Miscellaneous Receipts, Class 2. In view of the circumstances I would be glad to receive instructions as to the action that should be taken by me in the matter.
