Sir:-

In compliance with your request of the 4th instant, authority is hereby granted for you to slaughter 20 calves and 30 hogs, as required for subsistence of pupils of the school, under the conditions prescribed in sections 449-50, Regulations 1904.

In case it would be more profitable for you to sell the stock, or a part thereof, authority is hereby granted for you to advertise by means of typewritten notices or posters printed at the school shop, and by inviting proposals from parties likely to be interested, for the sale of said stock, and to sell the same, or such part thereof as may be deemed advisable, for the highest price obtainable, at public auction or private sale, for cash, at not less, however, than current market value.

If a sale is made, take up and account for the proceeds as Miscellaneous Receipts, Class 4, and in either case attach a copy of this letter to the woucher on which the animals are dropped from your account.
