Sir:

I respectfully report that last evening a fire started in the clothing room of small boys' quarters, due to the over-heating of the wall back of a stove which was used in this room to heat flat irons for the pressing of clothing. The fire was promptly discovered and with the exception of the burning of a couple yards of plaster no other damage was done. I immediately gave instructions to have the stove moved out of the building, as this is a dangerous place for it to be. Later on it is expected to make arrangements by an addition to the toilet building in the rear for a place which can be used by the boys of this building to press their clothing.
