Dear Sir:

On account of the smallpox quarantine at your school I was not permitted to enter the grounds on the Morning of Monday, Oct. 22, 1917, to unload three cars of coal in accordance with my contract, until permission was received from the state health authorities, thereby causing me to lose one day's time in hauling same.

This was the cause of my being taxed with one day's demurrage of \$2.00 each on these three cars. My contract with you provided that I pay all demurrage charges. However, in this case it is apparent that the school was at fault. I therefore request that you take into consideration the matter of paying this demurrage, which amounts to a total of \$6.00.
