Referring to my letter of August 6th wherewith I enclosed invoice in favor of the Corrugated Bar Company covering material ordered of them on your request, particularly referring to my remarks with reference to failure of the Corrugated Bar Company to handle this shipment as instructed by this office, I am enclosing herewith prepaid expense bill and B/L covering this shipment and claim of the Corrugated Bar Company for \$4.89 to reimburse them for freight charges which they advise would have accrued between Pittsburgh and Gettysburg Junction.

You will note that the expense bill and B/L covered shipment from Youngstown, Ohio to Gettysburg Junction.

If you are not in position to take any steps towards refunding to this company, I suggest that you take the matter up with the Washington Office, giving them all the facts in the case.

If you are in a position to make a refund, I would suggest before you do so that you write the Washington Office,

giving them the weights and description of the goods and ascertain what the freight would have amounted to on this shipment from Pittsburgh to Gettysburg Junction had it been covered by government B/L. Possibly the rate of freight would have been less than shown on enclosed claim.
