Sir:

I respectfully report, that since "Education Circular, No. 217" makes it absolutely necessary that we should know whether pupils desiring to enroll here, reside on a reservation or not, we have not had enough definite literature on hand to determine definitely what instructions to give such pupils.

Our copy of "Statistics of Indian Tribes, Agencies and Schools" is of the issue of 1903, and we have no official maps giving us the boundaries required.

I respectfully request that information be given me that will enable me to make requisition for the proper literature and maps needed.
