Sir:-

In reply to Office letter of the 6th instant, I have the honor to submit herewith a brief history of the Henderson tract of land, which has been rented by this school for a number of years past.

This tract of land contains about forty acres which adjoins the school grounds, and has been used for pasturage of the school herd every year being most suitably adapted, as there is a running stream through the length of the tract, which is about three-fourth of a mile long. Such parts of it as can be cultivated has been used for growing grain and corn during the summer. A small part of it is used for a skating pond for the pupils. At one end of the tract is a small grove where the pupils frequently picnic. Through this tract of land has been placed a road which connects the school with the town proper, which would probably have to be abandoned if the land is not leased.

In connection with the present lease, I have the honor to advise that authority has been granted to cover the same out of the regular appropriation, in the sum of \$400 which sum is expended at \$100 each quarter.
