As the school can hardly afford the expenditure of more than ten or eleven thousand dollars out of the Repair and Improve-

Fund for this building, I respectfully request authority to make up a list of the material and labor for this building, and to send proposals for the material to various dealers and to the warehouses, so that prices may be obtained. While this will entail a large amount of extra labor on us here at the school, it will, undoubtedly, result in a large saving such as would justify such action.

Immediately upon receipt of such authority, itemized lists of the material will be prepared and sent out. The importance of prompt action is indicated in the memorandum which I left at the Office while in Washington some months ago, and is also shown in my letter of September 17, 1912, in which I call attention to the bad sanitary conditions in the present building. Please return the bids with the checks.

Sir:

In reply to your letter of September 17, 1912, you are hereby authorized to advertise for bids and enter into contract with the lowest responsible bidder or bidders for the proposed addition to the large boys' quarters at the Carlisle School.

Before proceeding in the matter, however, you are directed to incorporate in the specifications the general condition sheet, and requirements for cement herewith inclosed, as it is the opinion of this Office that the contractor should be responsible to the Government for the performance of his work and the return of all drawings, rather than to a private architect.

There are also forwarded cuts and text of plumbing fixtures adopted by the Government to secure uniformity of materials and workmanship.

When you have made a contract it should be forwarded to this Office together with the required bond, for approval.

As near as I can estimate the improvement will cost about \$10,000. I thought originally of having this building put up with school labor and by open market purchases, but after careful thought and consideration, taking into account the necessity for the new building at the earliest possible date, I believe the present course is justifiable and highly advisable. We have so many repairs and improvements which the school will have to attend to with its own force at present under way and contemplated during this fiscal year that it will be impossible for the force to finish this lavatory building.

The dining hall is being repaired, the school building will need extensive repairs, there is an appropriation for finishing the steam heating plant, and numerous other repairs in the girls building and in the large boys' quarters which will have to be attended to by the school force, and our hands will be full of this work without attempting the erection of this lavatory.

The plans have been made carefully and will take care of our needs in that building. I have tried to indicate the importance of getting this improvement under way without delay, and I, therefore, respectfully request early action in the matter.

Memorandum by Mr. Friedman.

Lavatory Building.

FILED BY C. P. F.

For the past three years, I have recommended that funds be provided for the erection of a lavatory building in connection with the Large Boys' Quarters. The old structure is unsanitary, and has not only been reported against by the physicians of the school, but by every supervisor who has ever visited and inspected it. It is old and dilapidated, with old style plumbing, wooden floors, and unsatisfactory ventilation. Up until this year it has been impossible to rectify this by building a new addition. This year Congress made an appropriation of \$20,000 for repairs and improvements out of which there will be no difficulty in replacing this old building. I submitted plans about two years ago which were considered satisfactory by the Office. I have had some important changes made in these plans which will make the building to be erected more satisfactory for our use, and these plans will be submitted in a day or two.

I shall recommend in my letter transmitting these plans that authority be given me to advertise for bids, so that this addition may be built by contract. Were it not for the fact that there is a good deal of work on hand, including remodeling of the dining hall,

installing of lavatories and washing facilities in the girls' building, and finishing the steam heating plant, which must be done by purchasing material and doing most of the labor with the school force, this lavatory building could be built in a similar way. However, we shall have all we can do satisfactorily without the lavatory building, and I urge that authority be granted to advertise for bids looking to the erection of this building by contract. As far as I can estimate, the contract price should not be over ten thousand dollars.
