P. Henderson and others, owners.

land is used by the Indian Service for pasture and hay land. A map is also submitted showing the location of the proposed sewer, and it is understood that the pipe line will be beneath the surface of the ground, well covered, and so laid as not to interfere with any drainage pipes of the school that are or may be placed in its vicinity.

construction of this sewer through the leased premises by the lease and assent is hereby given to the granting of an easement for the sewer by the lessors of the property to the Borough of Carlisle as shown on the map submitted (No. 3095), drawn by John C. Hiteshaw, Borough Engineer, the pipe to be laid and constructed as hereinbefore mentioned, and in such manner that it will not in any way interfere with the use of the premises by the lesses, in accordance with the terms of the lesse.


