Sir:

The Indian Office has received through the Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School a communication of March 6, 1913, from the representative of the Borough of Carlisle, Pennsylvania, requesting the permission of the Indian Service for construction of a sewer through land leased by the Carlisle School from A. P. Henderson and others, owners.

The land in question adjoining the school land is used by the Indian Service for pasture and hay land. A map is also submitted showing the location of the proposed sewer, and it is understood that the pipe line will be beneath the surface of the ground, well covered, and so laid as not to interfere with any drainage pipes of the school that are or may be placed in its vicinity.

The Department has no objection to the construction of this sewer through the leased premises, and assent is hereby given to the granting of an easement for the sewer by the lessors of the property to the Borough of Carlisle as shown on the maps submitted (No. 3095), drawn by John C.
