Sir:

Under date of June 2 the Office replied to your letter of May 17, in which you requested that arrangements be made for the slaughter of one animal of the Carlisle School herd and that the animal be shipped to Harrisburg, Pa., and Dr. F. W. Aisworth notified.

On the same date the Office directed the Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School to carry out the suggestions which you had made, but he now advises that prior to receipt of Office letter the cow had become emaciated and that he believed her prompt removal from the barn to be necessary, and therefore she was killed and after removal of the hide the carcass was buried.

Sir:

I respectfully acknowledge receipt of Office letter of June the 2nd, regarding the disposal of the cow which gave a reactionary test when the same was applied by Dr. F. C. Bigelow on May 5th and 6th, last.

In reply thereto I have to report that the cow had become so emaciated and was failing so rapidly that her prompt removal from the barn and her killing was recommended because of the danger of effecting other cattle. In compliance with the recommendation the animal was killed, and after the hide had been taken off the carcass was buried.

Under date of May 17 the Office has been advised by the Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry that a tuberculin test was applied May 5 and 6 by Dr. F. C. Bigelow to four cows owned by the school. Three of these appear to be free from tuberculosis and the remaining animal gave a reaction indicating the presence of the disease.

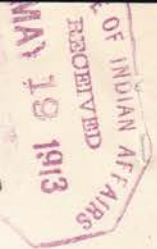
The Bureau of Animal Industry desires that arrangements be made for the slaughter of this animal subject to post-mortem examination by an inspector of the Bureau and suggests that the animal be shipped to the Brelsford Packing & Storage Company, 7th & North Sts., Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, and that notification of shipment be sent direct to Dr. F. W. Ainsworth, Bureau Inspector in Charge, care of Swift & Company, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

This Bureau is in receipt of a record of tuberculin test applied May 5 and 6 by Dr. F. C. Bigelow, Carlisle, Pa., an agent of the Pennsylvania State Live Stock Sanitary Board at Carlisle, to four cows owned by the Carlisle Indian School. Three of these are apparently free from tuberculosis and the remaining animal gave a reaction indicating the presence of the disease. It is desired that arrangements be made for the slaughter of this animal subject to postmortem examination by an inspector of this Bureau, and it is suggested that the animal might be shipped to The Brelsford Packing & Storage Co., 7th & North Sts., Harrisburg, Pa., notification of shipment being sent direct to Dr. F. W. Ainsworth, Bureau inspector in charge, Care Swift & Co., Harrisburg, Pa.
