Sir:

I regret to report to the Office that Marie Hutchinson, a seventeen year old girl enrolled here from the White Earth Reservation in Minnesota, died in the German Hospital in Philadelphia on the morning of May the 27th.

The girl had gone to an outing home for the summer months, and it was reported to me on May the 22nd that she was suffering from an appendice abscess. Arrangements were made at once for her removal to the German Hospital in Philadelphia, and after the consent of her parents had been secured an operation was performed by Dr. Deaver, a specialist in major surgical operations.

The remains of the girl were sent to Detroit, Minnesota, at the request of Superintendent Howard, and

were accompanied by Dorothy Morse, an acquaintance of the girl from the same vicinity of her former home.

The entire case was handled by telegrams and with promptness and the girl had as good medical and surgical attention as can be had in the land.
