Sir:

I respectfully report that Addie Foster, a Choctaw girl who was enrolled at Carlisle on September the 17th of 1914, died on Saturday afternoon, January the 29th.

The body was prepared for shipment and on Sunday afternoon was forwarded by express to the girl's former home at McAlester, Oklahoma.

The girl was not very strong at any time while at Carlisle and on January the 3rd had to be brought in from the Outing home to which she had gone. She was suffering with an acute attack of la grippe and at once showed unmistakeable symptoms of general tuberculosis. At no time after her return here was she able to be moved and it was soon apparent that death would probably result soon.
