Reports death of James Graybeard.

Sir:

I respectfully report that James Graybeard, one of the Cherokee boys enrolled at Carlisle, died at his outing home on February the 1st and that the body was shipped to his mother's home at Cherokee, North Carolina, at the request of Superintendent Henderson.

My

James was taken ill on January 28th. He had become injured at play while in school and a severe cold he had at the time caused him increasing sharp pains in his injured side. It was believed at first that he must be suffering with inflammatory rheumatism and when Mr. Dickey, our Boys' Outing Agent, was sent to the home he wired on January the 31st that James's condition had become serious. On Tuesday afternoon the boy died and the attending physician reported that death was caused by an acute attack of double pneumonia.
