I transmit herewith a letter from Dr. Rachel R. Williams, with reference to giving a series of talks to our girls on personal hygiene. This is one of the most important subjects with which we have to deal, and it has been my experience that it is one of the subjects which is most uniformly neglected throughout the Service. Through some friends, we were able to obtain Miss Williams's services last year for several days, and her intimate talks to the girls proved of great value and usefulness. She submits another proposition for similar work this year, covering a week, and I am heartily in favor of having her come and give this instruction.

I respectfully recommend to the Office that authority be granted to employ Dr. Williams for this purpose at such a time as is most desirable at the school, after all the students are here. Dr. Williams has a splendid reputation in Philadelphia, and has done much work along this line/talking to the girls of that city. Her experience is wide and her training for the work fits her to render thorough service at Carlisle.
