Sir:

Replying to Office letter dated June 17, 1916,  
requesting to be advised whether we expect to have any  
students prepared at the beginning of the coming school  
year for taking up the vocational work for any year  
beyond the first, I have to advise that according to  
our records, if all students who are now at home on  
leave and who have been returned to their homes on  
account of the expiration of enrollment period return, we  
will have students in each of the four vocational  
years as follows:

- First Year Vocational, ..... 90
- Second Year Vocational, .... 37
- Third Year Vocational, ..... 63
- Fourth Year Vocational, .... 63

This makes a total of 253 students eligible for the  
vocational classes.
