My dear Fr. Stock:

Referring to your personal call on October 31, 1913, regarding the furnishing of chaperons for the Carlisle girls attending morning mass, I have taken the matter of designating student chaperons up with Superintendent Friedman.

Mr. Friedman advises me that the designation of students as chaperons was discussed previously with you and that while you were willing for student chaperons to be detailed he has found that the detail of such chaperons results in partially administered discipline, because the girls' conception of responsible leadership in matters of discipline is immature and imperfect. The Superintendent feels that to inaugurate such a plan will be dangerous.

You will understand of course that I must hold the Superintendent of the School responsible for the proper protection and discipline of the students under his charge at all times. In view of his evident feeling that student chaperons are inadvisable, I must

ask you to either furnish chaperons for the pupils to attend Sunday morning mass, or permit the students to attend mass at another hour.

I appreciate your personal call very much, and hope that when you are in the city again you will drop in and see me at any time.
