I inclose herewith a letter dated the 23d instant from John Foster, one of our Alaskan pupils who is and has for two or three years been employed in the office of the chief train dispatcher of the Philadelphia & Reading Railway, Philadelphia, in regard to the enrollment of his brother Thomas as a pupil at Carlisle.

In reply to a previous letter said John Foster was informed that under the decisions of your Office we could not pay transportation for Alaskan pupils coming to Carlisle to be enrolled and that their enrollment, even if their transportation were paid by themselves, would be subject to approval by your Office. You will note that his brother proposes to arrange for paying the transportation of Thomas Foster, and it is respectfully recommended that permission be granted for his enrollment as a pupil at Carlisle if the cost of his transportation is met by his relatives.
