of Henry Fox, pupil.

Sir:

I regret to have to report the death of Henry Fox, a pupil of the Pawnee tribe, which occurred at the school hospital early yesterday morning, the 24th instant. This boy came in from a country home last week suffering with pulmonary tuberculosis and it was expected that we would be able to send him to his home; but he continued to have hemorrhages of the lungs, one of which was the immediate cause of his death. The death was reported by wire to Superintendent Nellis of the Pawnee Agency who replied with a request that the body be shipped to Pawnee, Okla., for burial. Arrangements have been made to forward the same today.

The deceased was 18 years of age and had been a pupil of the school since August 24, 1905.
