Sir :

I am in receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo, enclosing the application for enrolment in the Carlisle School of Anita McLaughlin, an Alaskan girl 18 years old.

You say that Mr. F. J. McLaughlin of Gallitzin, Pennsylvania, is willing to pay the transportation of this girl to Carlisle. I assume that she is with him at Gallitzin, and if so the question of her incoming expense is a very small item. The main point is, will he guarantee the money to cover her return transportation to Alaska when she has completed the two or three-year term for which it would be proper to enrol her as she is now 18 years old.

Before giving a definite answer I should like to have a fuller history of the girl ; why did she leave the Chemawa School ; how long has she been in the States ; what relation is Mr. F. J. McLaughlin of Gallitzin to her ; has she any means of her own ; and any other data which will give the Office a better understanding of the situation should be added.

As requested, the enclosures are herewith returned.
