I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. J. B. Mortsolf, Day School Inspector at Rosebud Agency, S. Dak., asking me to give my consent to the enrollment at Carlisle of Moses Stranger Horse, who was expelled from this school December 6th last, and whose expulsion was approved in Office letter dated December 19, 1907-Education 96966-1907-File 820.

I do not wish to stand in the way of this boy's making something of himself, if this is possible, and therefore will offer no objections to his going to Carlisle. But I am making this statement solely because of Mr. Mortsolf's recommendation and not from any faith I have in the boy myself.

rate from there to Carlisle. He should be able to travel without
escort.
