Dak., asking me to give my consent to the enrollment at Carlisle of Moses Stranger Horse, who was expelled from this school December 6th last, and whose expulsion was approved in Office letter dated December 19, 1907-Education 96966-1907-File 820.

I do not wish to stand in the way of this boy's making something of himself, if this is possible, and therefore will offer no objections to his going to Carlisle. But I am making this statement solely because of Mr. Mortsolf's recommendation and not from any faith I have in the boy myself.

William Hodge lives at Requa, on the old Klamath River Reservation, about 62 miles from Hoopa, and was not in school here last year. What application form should be used?
