Sir:

I respectfully report that Mr. Thomas Casey of
Hogansburg, N. Y. desires the return home of his son, John
Casey. This boy was enrolled at the Carlisle School on
Sept. 26th, 1906, at the age of ten years. In May, 1907,
he went to the country under our Outing System, and has
remained there since that time. He was not returned home
with the other New York children under fourteen years of
age, for the reason that he had such a good country home
and because he was doing so well.

In view of the general policy of the Office in re-
gard to the pupils from New York State, I respectfully re-
quest that authority be granted me to discharge this boy
from the School and to return him to his home.
