I enclose a letter from Harry L. Keefe of Walthill, Nebraska, asking that Antoine Lewis, an Omaha Indian, who is now enrolled at the Carlisle school be released and returned to his home at Bancroft, Nebraska.

This boy's mother died several years ago and he has made his home with his grandmother who is a white woman and an intelligent woman. As their home is just outside the limits of Bancroft, Nebraska, he would have an opportunity of attending the high school there and it seems that it might be better for him to be at home rather than so far away. I submit the matter to the Office for consideration.
