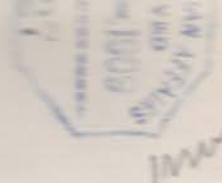

Answering your letter of September 22nd, 1909 Education - Administration #71172-1909 enclosing a letter from Daniel Magee, dairyman at this school, requesting permission to attend Carlisle school, I respectfully report that this boy is of the Mission tribe and is half Indian. He spent seven years in public school, one year at a Mission school at San Diego, three years at Perris and one year at Sherman Institute. He was in the eighth grade when he left this school and has been employed here about four years as an assistant and as dairyman. I advised him of the conditions on which he could enter Carlisle if it was deemed advisable for him to go to any school, and since he would have to pay his own transportation he says he does not care to go. He has just taken an examination for the position of ranger in the Forest Service and if he passes this and obtains an appointment, he will not desire to enter any Indian school. His letter is returned herewith.
