Sir:

Referring to Office letter dated October 7th, 1909, marked "Education - Administration, 77251-1909, A.V.S.", and in regard to the enrolment of Paul Wing, I respectfully report that I have carefully noted all the correspondence in connection with his application and that he seems to be a very undesirable student.

In view of the fact that the Office has decided to waive the rules concerning the enrolment of over-age students in the case of Asa Sweetcorn, also a member of the same tribe at Sisseton, and a young man who is acquainted with this Paul Wing, I beg leave to recommend that both of them should not be brought here. However, if the Office desires that this Paul Wing shall be given a chance to prove the sincerity of his endeavor to get away from the



Sir:

The Office has been considering the applications made by two young Indians of your reservation, Asa Sweetcorn and Paul Wing, to enter Carlisle School for a term of three years.

On September 24 you recommended that Paul Wing be given this opportunity, notwithstanding his past history. Neither of these applicants has a good record. The manner in which they have heretofore conducted themselves on the reservation, taking no interest in any occupation or useful pursuit, shows conclusively that they should not at once be given the privilege.

These young men have been advised to consult with you concerning their future, and it is hoped that you will be able to suggest some available means by which they may prove their determination to fit themselves for useful careers.

It is suggested that a portion of their time for a year or so might be given to elementary studies at the Sisseton School, and they would be still free to devote considerable attention to the earning of at least a part of their expenses. Some such arrangement might furnish a test whereby it could be decided what line of work they might best follow. Neither of them has indicated the trade for which he wishes to prepare himself.

Please report what success you meet with in your efforts to assist these Indians.

I have the honor to report on Office letter of September the 20th, as follows:

Paul Wing, the applicant for enrollment at Carlisle, is a young, full-blood Indian, living on this reservation, with no particular occupation to follow. He has been going with bad company and now wishes to get out of it, as he was becoming more worthless every day and now he finally decided to go to school where he can get out of this bad company and in time make a man out of himself. He has talked with Carlisle graduates and now he realizes that an education is of some value to a young man in his position. I talked with him and he seems to be in earnest about going to school and expressed a desire to enroll for a term of three years. I think that this would be of great benefit to him and be the means of making a man of him. I respectfully recommend that he be allowed to enroll at the Carlisle School, for a term of three years.



SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.
