Memorandum for Law:

Mr. T. L. St. Germaine has asked to be enrolled as a pupil at Carlisle Indian School, in order that he may attend Dickinson College.

Two propositions prominently are presented:

- 1. Mr. St. Germaine is over the age limit required for entrance at Carlisle, but this age limit easily can be waived by the Commissioner.
- 2. The appropriation for the Carlisle School will be drawn upon for Mr. St. Germaine to the extent that it will furnish him with clothing, subsistence, lodging, medical attendance, etc., with the exception of tuition, which he is to provide for himself at Dickinson College.

This second proposition is submitted as to the legality of the action proposed.
