Referring to Office letter of Sept. 28th, 1909, marked "Education - Administration, 75027-1909, A.V.S.", and relative to the enrolment of Jonas Swamp, I quote herewith a letter received from this young man under date of Sept. 1st, as follows:

"I should like to know if Carlisle is to have a Commercial Course this fall; if so, I should like to take up the Shorthand and Typewriting Course.

I completed the bookkeeping course at Haskell last June, and I wish to continue the Shorthand and Typewriting course at your school.

Hoping to hear from you soon, I remain, etc."

I also beg leave to quote a letter from Supt. Hart, of the Oneida School, written under date of Sept. 14th, and as follows:

"I forward herewith application of Jonas Swamp, age 21, for transfer to Carlisle. He has just completed a term at Haskell, and perhaps a strict construction of the rules would require that he finish there, but we have not here-
