The Office has received your letter of November 15, 1909, asking whether your son can be placed in the Carlisle School.

Unless there is some reason why your son can not attend the Washington schools, it does not seem to the Office that he should be placed in a Government school. Association with white children is considered a great advantage to Indians.

However, you may correspond with Superintendent Moses Friedman of the Carlisle School, and if your boy is well, has sufficient Indian blood and is over 14 years old, it is possible that he may be admitted there.
