Sir:

The Office has received your letter of January 24, 1910, requesting authority to enroll Caleb Carter, who is over 21 years of age and who was sent from the Fort Lapwai School, Idaho.

This authority is granted in accordance with your recommendation.

While it is noted that you were not informed by the Superintendent of the Fort Lapwai School, that this pupil was over age, nor that he was among those who were to be transferred, it should be said, nevertheless, that you should not arrange for the transportation of nor accept pupils from other schools, until you have been informed of the names, ages of such pupils, and any other facts which would disqualify them for admittance to Carlisle, unless, indeed, authority has been obtained from the Office.

Sir:

I am submitting correspondence herewith that will indicate that Caleb Carter was transferred from the Fort Lapwai School in Idaho without any indication whatever that he was an over-age student, or, in fact, without any knowledge on my part that he was to be one of the students who desired to be transferred.

He was sent to this school early in October and on the 12th of that month he was taken up on the rolls. On November 30th Superintendent Lipps was notified that permission would have to be secured for the enrolment, copy of such letter being also submitted herewith.

Under date of January 5th I took the matter into consideration with your Office and requested that authority be granted me for the enrolment.

My dear Mr. Lipps,--

I am in receipt of your letter of the 31st ult., and note that Rachell Penny and a party of four or five other Nez Perces will be ready to start to Carlisle about September 15th. I have requested the Northern Pacific Railroad Company to place (by telegraph) an unlimited number of tickets for the use of students coming to Carlisle from Lapwai. These tickets will be placed at North Lapwai, Idaho, according to your instructions.

If there are a number of large boys coming from Fort Lapwai, please arrange to have such boys start a day later than the girls; in this way, it will not be necessary to have an escort to accompany the students coming to Carlisle.


Dear Sir:

Rachel Penny was in the office this morning and said she would be ready to return to Carlisle about Sept. 15th and that she thought there would be four or five other Nez Perces who would return with her. She asked that I arrange the necessary transportation, and I believe under the rules now in force in reference to Carlisle I am to ask that you place the necessary transportation to my order, and I would suggest that the order read, that such tickets be furnished as I may call for, from North Lapwai Idaho to Carlisle Pa. If there are to be any large boys in this party, it would be necessary to either send an escort, or send some one out to take the party back, as the Nez Perce Indians object very much to have their daughters travel so far with large boys un-accompanied. I would suggest that you follow up this order with tracer to insure the receipt of it at the local ticket office here by the time the pupils are ready to go.

The Nez Perces are so badly afflicted with tuberculosis that we are exercising great caution in transferring

pupils to non-reservation schools and it is not probable that there will be any more large classes sent away from the reservation for this reason.

I respectfully request that authority be granted by your Office, for the enrollment of Caleb Carter, a Nezperce Indian, in the Carlisle School for a term of five years. This young man returned a few months ago from Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kansas, where he attended school for the past three years. His father is dead and he has considerable property interest on this reservation, including both his own allotment and inherited land. He desires to better qualify himself for caring for his property and earning a livelihood. He is a bright young man and I believe he should be given an opportunity to continue his education at Carlisle. Supervisor O. H. Lipps, who is now in Washington, is well acquainted with this young man and took a great deal of interest in him when he was in charge at this Agency, and can give your Office any additional information regarding him that might be desired.

SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.
