Sir:

I regret very much to report the death of Paul Sanders, a student enroled here from Charenton, La.

On December 3rd the young man was admitted to the School Hospital for treatment for inflammatory rheumatism, but when showing a marked improvement he became further afflicted with pneumonia and because of a weakened condition of his heart, caused by a very severe attack of rheumatism six years ago, he succumbed to the latter disease.

Upon receipt of advice from the parents that they desired to have the body shipped to their home a funeral service was conducted by the local priest and the body was forwarded by express on the afternoon of January 2nd.
