Death of pupil.

The Honoroble, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C.

Sir:

a student enrolled here from Shawnee, Oklahora. The young man was admitted to the school hospital early in June of this year. Shortly after an enlargement developed in his side and the school physician recommended that an operation should be performed. The patient consented to have the operation performed and on June 14th he was removed to the German Hospital in Philadelphia. He was operated on the following day and it developed that his organs were affected with tuberculosis. Later he suffered hemorrhages and death occurred on Monday forenoon, July 11th.

The body was returned to the school and was interred in the school burying ground. The pastor of the
church to which he belonged conducted services at the grave,
and the members of the young man's Troop of Cadets attended
in a body.
