In response to your letter of July 6, asking to be enrolled in the Carlisle Indian School, you are advised that it is contrary to the fixed policy of this Office to allow members of the Five Civilized Tribes, Oklahoma, to enter Carlisle except on payment of tuition, which, you say, you cannot do.

However, Haskell Institute at Lawrence, Kansas, offers all facilities for an education such as you desire, and if you are eligible in other respects, possibly you can be admitted to Haskell. If you wish to do this, communicate directly with Oscar H. Lipps, Supervisor in Charge, Muskogee, Oklahoma, who will consider your application and give you any information or assistance desired.

Juling a desire to letter my condition and net having sufficient funds to pay tution in a good preparatory school I wrote to the Supt, of the Indian Industrial (U.S.) at Carlisle Penna, and explained my situation; was informed that barlisle was well equipped to give boys an industrial education, but that I could not get an enrolment without special permission from
