Madam:

The Office has received your letter of September 18, 1910, inclosing your application for enrollment in the Carlisle Indian School, together with a letter from the Superintendent.

As it appears that your mother was a member of the Delaware tribe of Indians, incorporated with the Cherokee Nation of the Five Civilized Tribes, you are not eligible for admission to Carlisle, and the Office can not make an exception in your case to its established policy.

Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kansas, offers excellent facilities, and possibly you could be enrolled there, if the school has not been filled already. If you wish to consider enrollment in Haskell, communicate directly with Oscar H. Lipps, Supervisor in Charge, Muskogee, Oklahoma, who will advise you and give you all necessary assistance.

Dear friend Virginia:-

Your letter of September 2nd has been given careful consideration, and I regret very much that it will not be possible to assist you to return to Carlisle. When we paid your transportation home last summer, you had to be dropped from the school rolls, and it will now be necessary for the Indian Office to give your application for re-enrollment special consideration before you can be allowed to return. If it is not possible for you to secure funds to pay your own transportation to Carlisle, I would suggest that you submit your application to the Indian Office at Washington with a letter stating in detail why you desire to return.

I will be glad to do what I can to assist you in having the Office give your application favorable consideration, but as it is now, we cannot place transportation for you.

I am glad to know that you have improved in health, and I should certainly like to see you come back to Carlisle to complete your course. With very best wishes, I am,

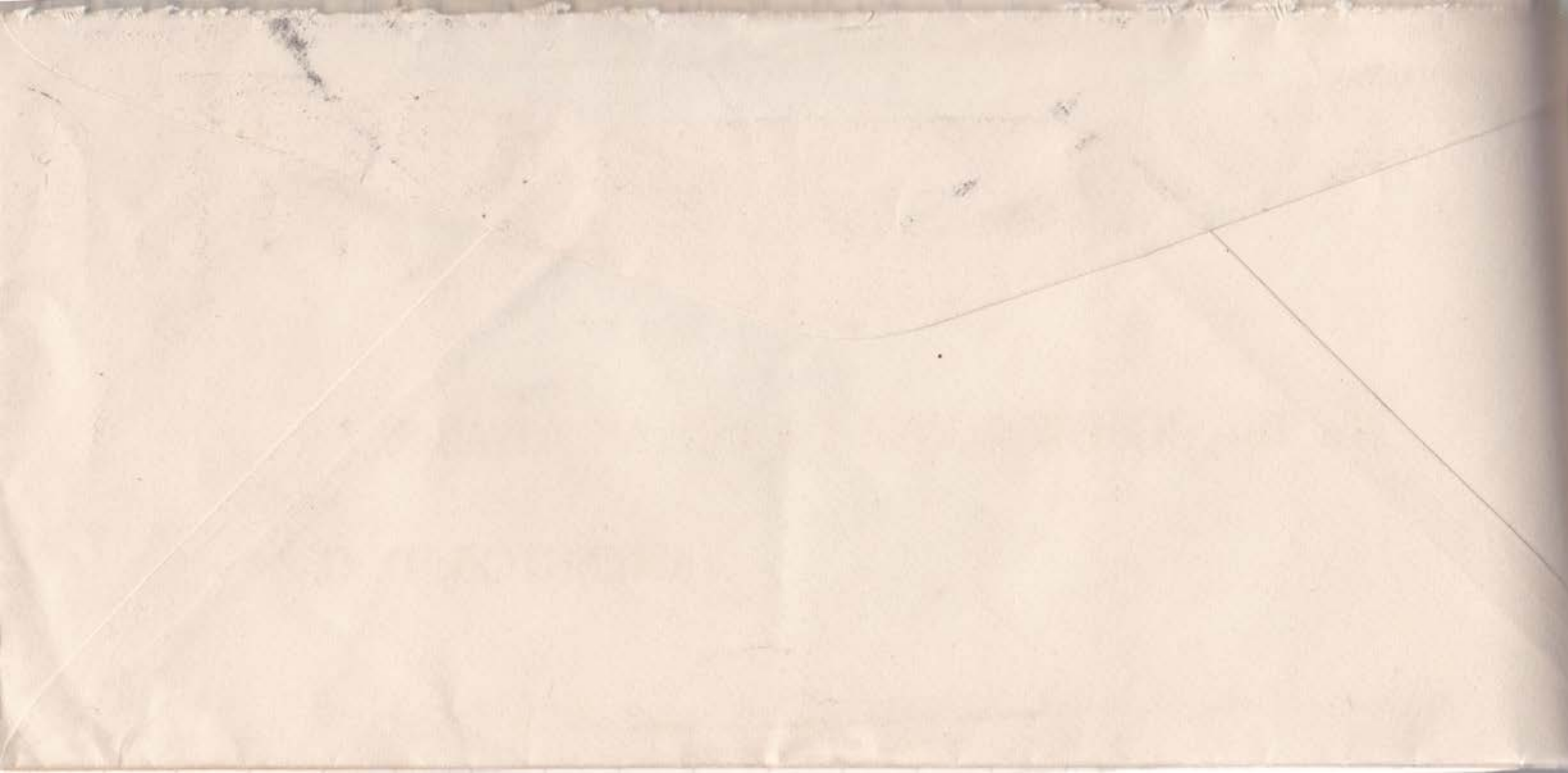

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.
