Sir:

The Office has received your letter of October 17, 1910, asking to be allowed to go to school at Carlisle, Pennsylvania; but no definite answer can be given you at this time, because your letter does not tell enough about yourself.

Your letter is dated at Fort Totten, North Dakota, but the Office cannot tell from this whether you are a pupil at the Fort Totten Indian School. If you are a pupil there, you should see Superintendent Ziebach and find out through him whether he is willing for you to go, and whether Superintendent Friedman at Carlisle is willing to receive you. If you are not enrolled at the Fort Totten school, it will be well for you to see the Superintendent, anyhow, and get him to advise you what to do and how to do it to get into the school.
