Sir:

This is to report to the Office that William Carpenter, enrolled here from Bason, New York, died at 2.30 A. M. on Saturday, January the 21st. The young man was a full-blood member of the Seneca Tribe and was nineteen years of age.

He was admitted to the school hospital on January the 14th, suffering with an attack of lobar pneumonia, but no serious results were anticipated until the day preceding his death.

Funeral services were conducted on Monday afternoon, January 23rd, with all students present, and the body was interred in the school burying-ground.
