Sir:

While Nehemiah Madison was out in the country under our Outing System he deserted and went to his former home in Massachusetts. Later he returned to the vicinity of the home from which he deserted, and as his presence in that Outing district was considered a menace to discipline and the welfare of the other boys at work in that district, he was apprehended and returned to this school.

Certain school privileges are being withheld from him at the present time, and as soon as he is thus deprived for a suitable length of time he will be returned to his home in Massachusetts, as it is believed that he is not a desirable student.
