Sir:

I transmit herewith certain affidavits testifying to the good record and reputation of one Cyrus Tallchief, who was enrolled at this school from 1900 to 1904. This Tallchief deserted from the school March 31st, 1904, and at that time he was credited with \$57.16 in the school bank. The amount to his credit was turned over to the Emergency Fund in 1904, but in 1905 all of these funds were hypothecated.

Since that time an amount has again been accumulated as Emergency Funds, and as this Tallchief has evidently been making a good record, and since he would probably make good use of the money if sent to him, I request that authority be granted me to pay him an amount of \$57.16 from the Emergency Funds.
