Sir:

In reference to the letter to yourself, which was left informally in the Indian Office today, from Matie Ray, of Dalzell, South Carolina, you are advised that this person made application to the Superintendent of the Carlisle School for enrollment last July. In answering the Superintendent, the Office at that time said that as this young woman was a member of a tribe of Indians who had not for many years, if ever, received any support or assistance in securing an education from the Government, it was of the opinion that it would be unwise to enroll her at Carlisle.

The papers in connection with the case were returned to the Superintendent of that school, and no further information is on file in this Office in reference to her. It is now the policy of the Indian Office to educate only these Indians for whom the States do not provide. This young lady seems to be living in a white community, and unless it should appear that she is deprived of securing an education at her home, the Office ought not to modify
