The Office has your letter of February 8, 1912, inquiring what course should be pursued to enter your son at the Carlisle School, Pennsylvania.

You are informed that inasmuch as your son is only 12 years of age he is too young to be enrolled at the Carlisle School.

The fact is noted that your wife is part Indian, and you are a half-breed Sioux. Notwithstanding your Indian blood, it is apparent that you are within easy reach of public schools and this is an additional reason for not enrolling your son in an Indian school, as it is now the policy of this Office to deny enrollment to Indian pupils when public schools are within reach of their homes.
