Sir:

In reply to Office letter of May 18 relative to the matter of Adeline Boutong, an outing girl, visiting the home of Louis J. Carpenter in Washington, I beg to state that my decision denying such permission to the girl was made because of the undesirable home conditions and the character of Louis J. Carpenter, and for the protection of Adeline Boutong. The Office will no doubt recall that Louis Carpenter has been in a number of scrapes, and was expelled from Hampton, and from my own personal knowledge has brought disgrace to at least one Indian girl.

It would, consequently, be unwise to allow any girl who is a student of this school, or any other reputable girl, to be thrown into contact with him.
