I referred your letter to Superintendent Friedman and from his report at hand it appears that you requested permission to work under the outing system and this was granted you with the understanding that you would continue the work until the beginning of the next school term in September. It further appears that the present condition of your eyes is not such as to justify your abandoning the work at the outing home where you are now stationed.

In view of the foregoing I do not deem it advisable to approve your request at this time, and you should continue at your present post until such time as Superintendent Friedman shall direct your return to the Carlisle School.
