Sir:

The Office has your letter of July 22, in reference to the case of Elsie Rabbit, a Chippewa Indian girl, enrolled in your School, whose parents have requested her withdrawal therefrom on the ground that they have not consented to her transfer from the Bena School, Minnesota, alleging further that her physical condition is not good.

You state that Elsie is doing excellent work under the outing system, and up to July 1, her general condition of health was satisfactory. You enclose with your communication the application of this girl, together with certain correspondence having reference to the case under consideration.

From the correspondence submitted, it appears that the transfer of Elsie Rabbit to your School and her enrollment therein were made without the consent of her

parents, and although the said application is signed by the girl herself, it does not bind her, inasmuch as she was under age at the time this application was made.

Under the elecumstances, it is suggested that you communicate direct with the parents of this girl with reference to the health of their daughter, quieting their fears as to her condition, and enclosing, if possible, a statement from her as to her wishes in this matter.

If the parents then still insist upon Elsie's withdrawal from your school, you may drop her name from your school roll and return her home.

Reporting as was directed in Office communication attached hereto, I respectfully state that inquiry was made about Elsie Rabbit's health and that on June the 19th I received the following reply from her outing patron, Mrs. T. W. Morley of Marysville, Penn.

"Received your note in regard to Elsie Rabbit's health. She seems in usual health, barring a slight trouble with her eyes. I took her to my oculist, the best in Harrisburg, and he said she had a very mild form of trachoma. As he is our oculist he says he will treat her once a week free of charge. If you should deem it advisable to return her to the school for treatment please let me know at once before I take her to my physician. Awaiting a reply,"
