Sir:

This is to report to the Office that when Louis

C. Brown, a member of the Creek Tribe of Indians, was
enrolled here on the 11th instant he deposited an amount
of \$167.00 to pay for one year's tuition. Since then
the same has been placed to the credit of the Treasurer
of the United States as Miscellaneous Receipts, Class 1.

The young man came here with the idea of continuing with his college work, but finding that the courses fitted for vocational work rather than professional he requested permission to leave the school. It has been granted him and he has gone to his home.

Before leaving he applied for a reimbursement of the amount he had paid for tuition, and for the reason that the course here could not well be adapted to fit him for such training as he desires to secure I respectfully recommend that he be reimbursed for the amount of \$167.00 that has been paid.
