He states that the amount will be about \$35.00 for the remainder of this year. He was called home several weeks ago on account of the death of a brother, and returned to the school only a few days ago. He tells me that he has an arrangement with Conway Hall to take charge of their athletics next year, and this work will enable him to make his own way in school.
